"Kinder Kids International Adventure School"

K2/K3 students will remain in Kinder Kids International School Tokyo.

The Adventure School is designed to stimulate children's curiosity.

The spacious grounds are lush with trees, waterfalls, and ponds where children can play to their heart's content. In April 2023, Tokyo School will launch a new program that will add outdoor activities to the existing curriculum, making the most of this natural environment. The philosophy of the program consists of three basic concepts.

Three Concepts of Adventure School



Health

Nurture a healthy body and mind, which are the most important things in life

Wealth

Build a wonderful life through friendship and love.

Growth

Always work hard to the best of your abilities and pass on what you have learned to friends and those younger than you.

Kinder Kids has always provided an education with the hope that children will be exposed to nature on a daily basis and develop a sensitivity to the seasons. The Adventure School will increase the number of outdoor activities by about three times, and through the study of nature, we aim to develop the following skills.

- (1) Ability to overcome adversity
- (2) Foster independence and social skills
- (3) Deepen the relationship with nature
- (4) Experience a sense of accomplishment through experiences with nature



Effects of the Study of Nature on Child Development

While it is important to be good at using digital devices, spending too much time looking at the screens of smartphones and tablets has been pointed out to be detrimental to the healthy development of the body and mind. It is necessary to limit the time spent using these devices, and **spend more time talking with friends and playing outside**. By spending more time in contact with nature, children will encounter new sights, sounds, and smells, and their curiosity will be stimulated. Research has shown that **daily contact with nature improves self-awareness and the ability to perceive the feelings of others, and it also develops children's observation and imagination skills**. It is said that the brain is more active and absorbs more information when the same activity is done outdoors rather than indoors.



Outdoor Activities at Kinder Kids Adventure School

In the Adventure School, students **exercise, interact with plants and animals, make crafts using stones, branches, leaves, and other items found in nature, and learn science through nature**, such as compost making and building small dams. By developing an interest in the nature around them and through teamwork and imaginative play during the outdoor activities with friends, they will be encouraged to **try new things as well as gain self-confidence**.

Collaboration with outdoor brand "CHUMS"

"CHUMS" is an outdoor brand founded in 1983 by a river guide in Utah, USA. It offers a wide variety of products, from colorful and eye-catching camping goods to practical outerwear and fashionable kids' wear, and is loved by many fans around the world.

The Adventure School, based on the concept of learning in nature, and the popular outdoor brand CHUMS have collaborated to create an original backpack.

Interview with the Parents

How you spend your time is more important than getting into a good school. I want my child to become strong, and learn from mistakes rather than avoid making mistakes.

We interviewed the mother of N.M., a graduate of Kinder Kids Takatsuki School's first graduating class who is currently in the first year of junior high school. This interview resulted from a discussion meeting we held with four mothers of Takatsuki School graduates, and received a lot of feedback from the parents of current Takatsuki School students. This time, Ms. M spoke on behalf of the discussion meeting members about her thoughts on Kinder Kids and her daughter's experience with the junior high school entrance exam.

► Why did you decide to let your tstart learning English when she was a baby?

I wanted to expose her to English from an early age so she would not have trouble in the future with listening and speaking, which Japanese people are not good at.

I was also influenced by the information, "The ability to distinguish between L and R pronunciation is determined by the age of five"

I thought when she was older she could study abroad, but when I was pregnant with my daughter and saw the social turmoil caused by SARS and a new strain of influenza, I felt that even if she wanted to study abroad in the future, she might not be able to do so. Actually, that thought became a reality with the COVID-19 pandemic.

I thought that by going to an international school in Japan, she could study in an environment similar to that of foreign schools and also she could learn English with peace of mind, without being caught up in the confusion of the world.

► She transferred from another preschool to the newly opened Takatsuki School. What attracted you to Takatsuki school and how did you like it?

There are three main reasons why we decided to enroll her in Kinder Kids.

1. The system is designed for Japanese children

In the school she attended before Kinder Kids, she had to follow the foreign class system. It was divided into classes based on age in months, and my daughter, who was born between January 1st and April 1st, sometimes did not have the same opportunities as other preschoolers in her grade, I was fascinated by the fact that Kinder Kids had the advantages of both a Japanese preschool and an international school.

2. Adaptability to Japanese elementary schools

Kinder Kids taught her how to behave properly, so I didn't have to worry about it when she went to elementary school. In fact, when I asked her elementary school teachers about my daughter's behavior and Japanese language skills, they assured us that there were no problems at all.

3. Children first and open to opinions

At her previous school, when I made some requests, they were immediately turned down and not even considered. I thought Kinder Kids' system was almost perfect, I could feel the staff's ambition to make the school even better by putting the child first and listening to parents' opinions. Kinder Kids was really just as I thought it would be and I thought "I wish she had enrolled sooner! I envy parents whose children have taken lessons starting from Baby Class!"

I heard that Kinder Kids recently established a new elementary school, if it had been opened in my daughter's time, I might have had a hard time deciding which elementary school to attend. I envy the current Kinder Kids students because they have more options.



► About keeping English skills after graduation

Because of the influence of her older brother, she was considering taking the junior high school entrance exam and had been attending cram school and taking other lessons since the first grade of elementary school. She chose to focus on other subjects, believing that the English language skills she had gained in Kinder Kids would not be lost. As a result, the school that my daughter entered emphasized English and she was able to make the most of her English skills.

► I understand she took the Eiken test at a late age.

I was certainly anxious because some children in K3 were already taking the Eiken Grade Pre-2 test. I thought it would be better for her to take the test later, and she decided to take the test in her first year of junior high school and could pass the exam just by solving past questions about 3 days before the exam. Unless your child is planning to take exams that require Eiken qualifications, it is hard for parents to support their children in taking exams at an early age. If your child is not enjoying preparing for taking the Eiken test, I think it would be better to delay the test to avoid putting pressure on your child.

► How did you overcome your daughter's rebellious stage before the entrance exam?

Parents want their children to have a happy future, so they tend to put too much emphasis on their children's entrance exams.

I researched various study methods, adopted whatever I thought was good, tried the then-popular "Sato-mama" method, and enrolled my daughter in an intensive study course for a hard-to-get-into junior high school. She followed my methods and learned more and more, but she began to rebel because I kept making demands. She was having a hard time and began to think, "It's hard to do what mom says" and stopped listening to me. I thought that if she continued to rebel, it would be difficult for her to take the entrance exam, so I changed the way I treated her.

Gradually, she started studying again, passed the entrance exam, and is now enjoying a fulfilling student life at her current school.

《Don't make taking the entrance exam your goal.》

Passing the entrance exam of the target school tends to be the goal, because after passing the exam, children often lose their motivation for studying, so I think it is necessary to support them so that they can have goals beyond the exam.

► How exactly did you treat her?

I tried to raise her self-esteem by praising her. I praised her when she voluntarily went to her desk to study, when she found her weak points and worked hard to strengthen them, and so on, I praised her for her efforts and what she was able to do on her own, even if it was a small thing.

I gave my daughter decorated cards praising her for her hard work, imitating the decorated cards that my daughter was so happy to receive praising her efforts from her cram school

► Lastly

I do not think there is only one correct educational method, but I often communicate with my children to make an atmosphere where they can easily express their feelings, and I try not to miss any signs from them.

Rather than trying to prevent children from making mistakes, help them to have the confidence to overcome the negative feelings of frustration, pain, and sadness!

The children will feel safer with their mother and father by their side, so please keep supporting them.

On her first day, I was worried about whether my shy daughter would be able to adjust to a foreign school, but she was warmly welcomed by the teachers, and I was relieved to see that she immediately fit in at her new class. I think it would be wonderful if she continues to exchange letters with her new friends she met through Kinder Kids. She also seemed to enjoy the warm school lunch because she was eating a lot.



H.A. (Takatsuki K1) Transferred to Oakville school

Oakville was rich in nature and we had a wonderful time walking around Lake Ontario and exploring in the bush! The magnificent natural landscape must have been mind-blowing for her. Oakville seems to have strict laws regarding childcare, which was interesting to me because it was quite different from Japan.



Y.A. (Yokohama K2) Transferred to Hawaii school

We tried Global Transfer because I couldn't give my son a chance to travel abroad during the coronavirus pandemic. The school environment was similar to Kinder Kids schools in Japan, so I think that made it easier for him to get used to the Hawaii school. The Kinder kids staff were helpful and supported us starting from our preparation stage. I thought it was quite reasonable to pay only the handling and transfer overseas fees.



M.K. (Fukuoka K1) Transferred to Hawaii school

Before the transfer, a teacher at the Hawaii school sent us an email in Japanese and I could ask some questions beforehand, which was great. I was worried that my daughter might cry and refuse to go to school, but from the first day, she had no trouble going to school and seemed to have a great time because she was reluctant to leave school. Probably because the transferred school was one of the Kinder Kids schools. She also liked the teacher and became more enthusiastic to speak and write English after this experience abroad.



H.S. (Nagoya K1) Transferred to Hawaii school

There were events related to the local culture, which were interesting and enjoyable for us. On weekends and after school, she was taken to see hula dancing which she loved, climb Diamond Head, play with dolphins, and the beach and pool from the daycare facility in the hotel. The school seemed popular among locals because we were often spoken to when she was walking around in her uniform.

My Study Methods

I'm taking lessons at Grad Club's After (school) Class and Saturday Class, and before the Eiken, I took "Eiken Study for Grade 2 Preparation Video Lesson". I was busy with other studies too, so the video lessons were very helpful so I could study at my own pace and convenience at home. I also used the official Eiken app "Study Gear" to learn vocabulary, because many of the words in Grade 2 were difficult. I was focusing on studying English before, but now I started studying Japanese and math in the evening group classes. I would like to keep studying English by using many different kinds of methods.

What I like about Kinder Kids!

From an early age, I started practicing writing English at Kinder Kids, and I think that helped me when I studied for the Eiken test. I also liked the fact that all the lessons in "Eiken Study" were spoken in English. I often have a hard time understanding the Japanese explanations, but the explanations in English were easy to understand.

About Grad Club's Eiken Study

You can take online video Eiken lessons that proceed at the same pace as the ordinary in-person Eiken group lessons. You can watch the video lessons as many times as you like for 12 days after the posting of the video, and you can take the lessons whenever you like. You can take the same lessons as the school lessons from your home.

Asked her parents How did you support her?

My daughter had other lessons and classes as well, so we decided not to concentrate on Eiken too much but to keep studying at her own pace. My husband and I are both working, so we didn't have much time to support her studies. She loves English, and Grad Club's After (School) Class and Saturday Class helped her to study for the Eiken and I am very grateful for those Grad Club's programs. The writing test and the interview test for Grade 2 are difficult for children because they need to express their opinions and thoughts on social issues and current affairs. We didn't take any special preparations but talked about current events in the news while watching the morning and evening news once or twice a week. I thought it would be better to gradually get used to talking about social topics and not to be in too much of a hurry.

Asked her parents My advice to friends

We were also reading the past issues of "Hiraku" and knew that some children were studying hard for the Eiken. A teacher at Kinder Kids told me, "Even if the parents are not good at English, their children will learn a lot if they like English", which has always supported me and encouraged my daughter to do her best. I now realize that was correct. I believe that if you keep studying the integrated programs from Kinder Kids through Grad Club, you will be able to pass the exam.
